## Any Other Business

The coaches will be asked to take this on.

2) Social Media. Discussion had on promoting the club to gain more membership, and Denise is going to ask her granddaughter to help set up a Facebook page to assist this purpose.

3) Cleaning rota to be arranged asap. Teresa to draw up. Tony has offered to clean the gents toilets on a Tuesday. Very welcome.

4) Clubhouse is sometimes not being locked up properly, Teresa to remind members in her next newsletter.

5) Two woods day and BBQ. These to be put back until it is easier to organise. After 21<sup>st</sup> June. Discuss next meeting.

6) It was suggested that out new members presently undergoing coaching be charged £2.50 for use of green to add funds for the club. This was dismissed as false economy, and the fact that new players have an expensive time with shoes clothes etc.

7) The first aid box needs updating and a responsibility given to someone for its upkeep. Teresa will ask Malcolm if maybe the coaches could take this on as we have trained first aiders within that group.

8) More helpers needed on a Tuesday morning. Teresa to email out to members and request more volunteers.

9) Thanks to Denise for painting the ladies toilets, a great improvement especially following the damage caused by a recent leakage.

10) It has been suggested that Malcolm be approached to come onto the committee as a support for the club maintenance. Tony Excell will ask Malcolm.

The clubhouse is falling into disrepair, and needs some urgent work done. The general feeling is that the Tuesday gang will be able to temporarily fix some of the problems but long term there is a larger financial issue that will have to be addressed.

Held over for next time for further discussion, after further government guidance as to the easing of final lock-down.
